St. Paul of the Cross (1694 - 1775)

St. Paul of the Cross was born Paul Francis Daneo in Ovada, Italy. From an early age, he learned how to see his own sufferings in the light of a God who suffered so greatly out of love for us.



It was this unequaled love of Jesus that captivated St. Paul and led him to ardently consecrate his life to God in the service of others. The Passion of Jesus set his heart on fire!

His zeal was contagious and through divine inspiration he gathered companions to live together committed to the Memory of the Passion and bringing this message of salvation to the world.

His spiritual sons and daughters are spread today through more than 60 countries worldwide.

- See the Passion of Christ lived in the Crucified of today.


What are our ministries?
